2015 IRHA Legislative Breakfast

The Idaho Rural Health Association was pleased to once again host its annual Legislative Breakfast. With legislators from across the state in attendance, our members and IRHA leadership were able to address issues important to rural health in Idaho including:

- Continuing to expand funding for health related education at Idaho's education institutions and programs that will place a growing health care workforce in rural Idaho.
- Supporting the Idaho Healthcare Coalition and its \$40 Million SHIP Grant to transform health care throughout the entire State of Idaho.
- Supporting Medicaid Expansion as a mechanism to allow those below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level to have access to timely health care.
- Supporting Telemedicine in Idaho as proposed by the Idaho Telemedicine Council to ensure the highest quality of care as close to home as possible.

As you may know from reading our IRHA Legislative Updates, while some of these issues are resolved and have been successful, others are not. As a valued member of IRHA, we welcome your participation and involvement as we work to connect the importance of these issues with our state legislators. The interactions we pursue with our legislators make a significant difference. This breakfast gathering is just one of many avenues IRHA is working to improve the health of rural Idaho and advocate for positive change.

I am pleased to also note that several of our legislative colleagues also chose to become members of the IRHA. This allows those legislators to stay informed through the IRHA newsletter and other timely material on health care issues in rural and frontier Idaho.

Idaho State Loan Repayment Program (SLRP)

The Bureau of Rural Health & Primary Care invites you to explore this new opportunity for clinician and physician loan repayment. SLRP is a federal grant created to improve healthcare access in Health Professional Shortage Areas. **SLRP has recently been expanded to include full and part-time clinicians.** Award amounts range from \$5,000-\$25,000 per year, depending on discipline, and matching employer contributions.

Eligible facilities must:

- Be a nonprofit or public entity located in a Health Professional Shortage Area
- Provide a sliding fee scale for low income and uninsured patients and accept Medicare and Medicaid
- Provide \$1:\$1 matching loan repayment funds
